TEACHING EXPECTATIONS

Throughout the year, students will be explicitly taught the Awtrey behavior expectations: Respect Yourself, Respect Others, Respect Property.

Teachers will help students learn what the expectations "look" and "sound" like in every setting during the school day. These lessons will be retaught and reinforced throughout the school year and become a regular part of our instructional program.





PBIS Rewards

Students showing Awtrey expectations are rewarded points electronically for their positive behavior through the PBIS Rewards App. Each student is given a QR code attached to the inside cover of his/her agenda. When following rules and expectations, students are given points that they may use in their classroom, in



raffles, or at our Awtrey PBIS store.

Students and parents may track their points using the PBIS Rewards App. It is available on the iPhone/Pad App store, Google Play and the Amazon App store. Information with your student's registration code was provided at Open House. If you would like more information on how to download and use the PBIS Rewards App, please contact the office.

Frequently Asked Questions

DOES PBIS MAKE A DIFFERENCE?

PBIS is a research-based multi-tiered framework aimed at reducing problem behavior in order to maximize instructional time and improve school climate. Research shows that schools using the PBIS framework recover thousands of instructional time.

HOW IS PBIS DIFFERENT FROM OTH-ER PROGRAMS?

The PBIS framework focuses on the explicit teaching and acknowledgement of positive behavior. There are consistent routines, language, and consequences used throughout the school in order to empower and strengthen positive student choice.

WHO PARTICIPATES IN PBIS?

All students and faculty participate in PBIS with a focus on three tiers: primary, secondary and tertiary. The primary tier focuses on *preventing* behavior problems for all student. The secondary tier focuses on reducing the frequency and intensity of incidents targeting a small group of students. The tertiary tier focuses on reducing the frequency and intensity of incidents by providing individualized support for students as needed.
