

DURHAM STUDENT DRESS CODE

In keeping with Cobb County Dress Code Policy JCDB, Durham's dress code reflects a minimum standard of grooming and dress that reflects the respect for the formality of the learning environment. Proper dress is an important part of sustaining the formality of the school situation and we appreciate your support and cooperation.

Required standard of dress for students:

- Shoes must be worn at all times; house shoes, slippers, etc. are not permitted.
- Caps, hats or other head coverings are not to be worn in the building.
- No midriff shirts/blouses are allowed. Shirts and blouses should be long enough to be tucked in and stay tucked in when arms are raised.
- Appropriate under garments are required and should not be visible.
- Backless and strapless dresses, tops or blouses, tank tops, and other thin strapped tops may not be worn.
- Shirts/tops must cover the shoulder. No sheer garments and no low-cut necklines are permitted. Cleavage must not show.
- Shorts, skirts and dresses must be longer than mid-thigh.
- Clothing may not contain holes or fringes above mid-thigh or exposed undergarments. All pants and trousers must be worn at waist level, not sagging.
- Leggings, jeggings and yoga pants may be worn IF covered by shirts, dresses, shorts or skirts that are longer than mid-thigh.
- Very tight fitting stretch, spandex, or knit clothing is unacceptable attire without appropriate garments worn over the clothing.

Students who are improperly dressed are not allowed to attend class. Violators of the dress code will be placed in an alternative setting for the remainder of the day or until proper clothing is obtained. Any clothing which may create a disruption of the routine functions of a school day may be deemed inappropriate.
