

Morning Car Rider Information Spring 2014

Attention Parents:

To keep all of our students safe in the morning car rider line, please follow the procedures below:

1. Have student ready to exit the car as soon as your car is next to the curb (from the gym to the front door). Please do not wait until you are at the front door or until a staff member opens the door to let your student exit. The line will move faster if everyone exits as soon as the car is at part of the curb.
2. Please do not "get out of the line" after your student exits your car. Moving into the outside lane causes many near-miss accidents in the morning and is not a safe action for students or parents. Please wait patiently until you are past the front door to go the way you need to go to exit the parking lot. The cones divide the car rider line and the other lane for moving vehicles. Please do not go between the cones to the outside lane.
3. Please do not drop off students on the other side of the parking lot, park and let your student exit by themselves in a parking space to walk across. This is dangerous! Please only use the car rider line next to the curb to drop off students.
4. Please do not go into a parking spot, help your children out, walk them across the parking lot, then turn around and leave. You are holding up the car rider line. Be patient! Wait in the car rider line and let your child out at the curb.
5. Please do not ever park in the bus drop off lane over by the fence/sidewalk. Buses need to move in and out efficiently.
6. Car riders may be dropped off as early as 7:15. The earlier you are, the less of a car rider line you will encounter which means a fast drop off and exit for you.

Please know that all children's safety is our first and foremost concern. Please follow the guidelines to help us keep everyone safe and moving quickly. Bring your patience and understanding as we unload cars in the morning. The bus is always an alternative and will keep you from getting frustrated in the car rider line. ☺ Thank you!
