



Introductory Notes Related to School Capacity Information in This Report

For many years the student capacity of our schools has been determined by the State Department of Education's facilities charts. However, today, these charts do not always accurately reflect the actual usage of space in a school building.

Accordingly, for elementary schools, and later for middle schools, in 2008-2009 a Classroom Capacity Study was conducted to provide a more precise accounting of the number of students a school can practically hold before the need for portable classrooms is required.

This study took into consideration many factors that affect the usage of classrooms. These included special programs such as; Early Intervention Program (EIP), Special Education, ESOL, Gifted, etc. Some of these programs have State DOE mandated class sizes that are considerably smaller than the general use size of a classroom and therefore significantly reduce the student capacity of the school.

Data was collected from grades K-1, K-2, K-5, 6, and 6-8 schools, analyzed, and is presented on the following pages of this report in the Capacity column for those school types.

For high schools, the Department of Education's capacity number is presented in the Capacity column for those school types.
