Our Goals for Student Achievement

District Goals:

- -By the end of the 2018-19 school year, 100% of the schools and district will use our collaborative data-driven process, Cobb Collaborative Community (CCC), to improve learning.
 -CCSD will increase the participation rate of families and communities engaging in services/ programs by 10% as measured by ParentVUE data, survey results & web view module.
- -By the end of the 2018-19 school year, 100% of the schools and district will use a common assessment to measure the impact of professional learning which will, in turn guide decisions on how best to support teachers and leaders in high poverty/needs schools.

Hollydale Goals:

By the end of the 2018-2019 school year, all students will show a 125-point increase in Lexile as measured by the Scholastic Reading Inventory.

By the end of the 2018-2019, increase the percentage of students performing grade level or above in math by 5% as measured by the Cobb County Touchstones (K-2) and Georgia Milestones (3-5).

By the end of the 2018-2019 school year, all students will show an increase in cooperative behavior and therefore spend more time in the classroom learning rather than in ISS or OSS as measured by a 10% decrease in the number of days in ISS and OSS of the overall student body.
