LITERACY

This week our focus books were written by author Eric Carle. We read The Hungry Caterpillar, The Grouchy Lady Bug, and The Very Lonely Firefly. We concentrated on identifying the characters and setting within each read aloud. We learned that characters have feelings, thoughts, and actions. We also learned that the setting can change throughout the book. We pulled in science standards by talking about the characteristics of each animal.

As you read to your child at home, encourage him or her to identify the characters and the setting of each story.



Continue to read to your child at home. In doing so, talk about the characters (who is in the story) and setting (where does the story take place). Ask about what happened in the beginning, middle, and end as well.
