LITERACY

This week, we have continued to ask and answer questions. We are asking questions about the day and night sky, as well as describing the patterns and changes that occur.



As you read to your child at home, ask them questions about the text that

was read like who was in the story?, what was the story about?, where did the story take place?, etc. Also, see what your child can tell you about motion and the different way things move.

MATH

We will continue our study on greater than, and equal to. The students will focus on comparing the numbers 1-10. We will also be classifying objects and comparing numbers on a graph integrating Veterans Day.

When at the store, have your child compare the numbers of prices. Ask them which number is greater than or less than. You can also have your child count out two different sets of buttons or beans and have them tell which set is greater.

PHONICS

Our focus letters this week were "a" and "m". We began to blend the letters together. We have continued working on rhyming words, counting the syllables, focusing on the initial sound of a word, and segmenting the word. Have your child name words that have the /a/ sound at the beginning and name words that have the sound in the middle of the word.

To help your child at home, go on letter hunts. Be on the lookout for objects in our everyday lives that begin with any of the letters that have already been introduced. Your child has been introduced to letters A- Z at this point in the year, so reviewing these letters is very helpful. Your child should be able to identify each letter, as well as tell you the letter sound. Knowing their letter sounds helps them when reading and writing.
