LITERACY

This week, we are making predictions and asking questions about informational books. We are able to identify informational books by the author's use of photographs and the author writing facts about the topic in the book.

As you read informational books with your child at home, allow them to look at the photographs in the book and discuss how the author uses the photographs to support the facts written in the book.

MATH

We are continuing with working on counting and writing numbers from 1 to 20, identifying them and the sets that make them.

Wherever you are with your student: home, a store, a park, etc...have your child count and compare the different ways to show numbers from 1 to 20. They should also practice writing the numbers to develop this small motor skill too.

PHONICS

Our focus letter this week was the addition of the short vowel "a". We will continue to work with the short vowel "i". We will keep blending the letters together to make words using consonants, "p, f, n, h, s, t".

Example: f - a - t : fat

We have continued working on rhyming words, counting the syllables, focusing on the initial sound of a word, and segmenting the word. Have your child name words that have the \n\ sound at the beginning and name words that have that sound at the end of the word.

To help your child at home, go on letter hunts. Be on the lookout for objects in our everyday lives that begin with any of the letters that have already been introduced. Your child has been introduced to letters A- Z at this point in the year, so reviewing these letters is very helpful. Your child should be able to identify each letter, as well as tell you the letter sound. Knowing their letter sounds helps them when reading and writing. Also, practice writing and sounding out the words: pin, fat, tip, if, and am.
