Math



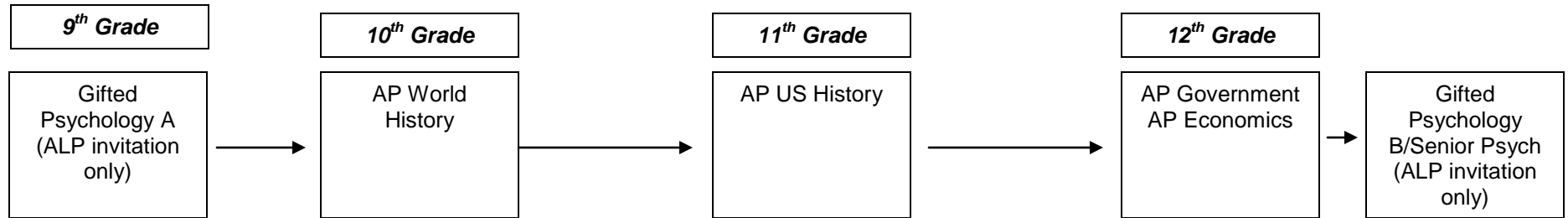
Math 4 is equivalent to Advanced Algebra and Trigonometry

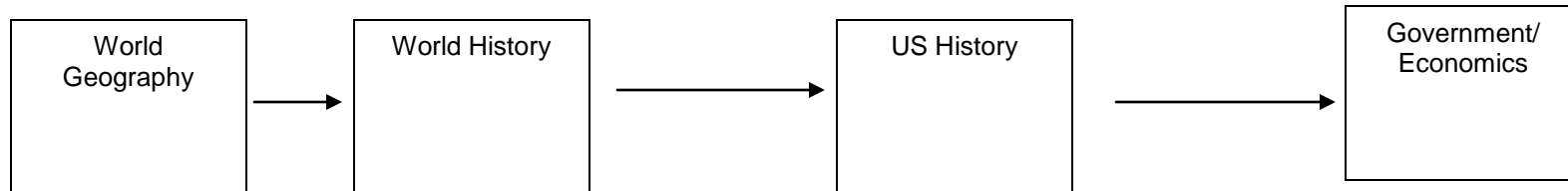
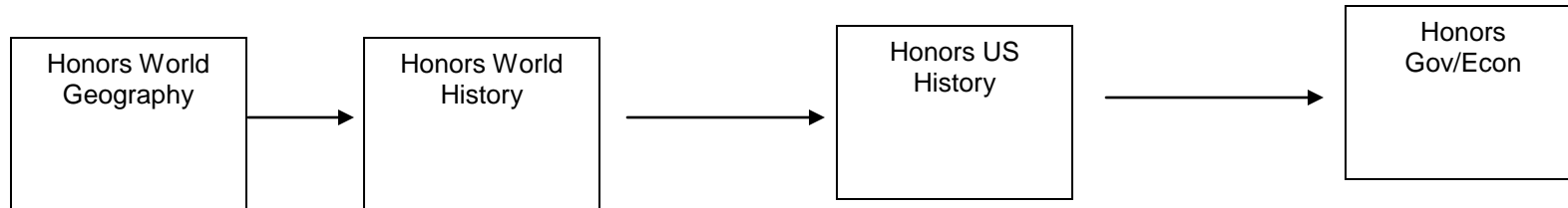

Students may move from Honors to AP courses with a teacher recommendation

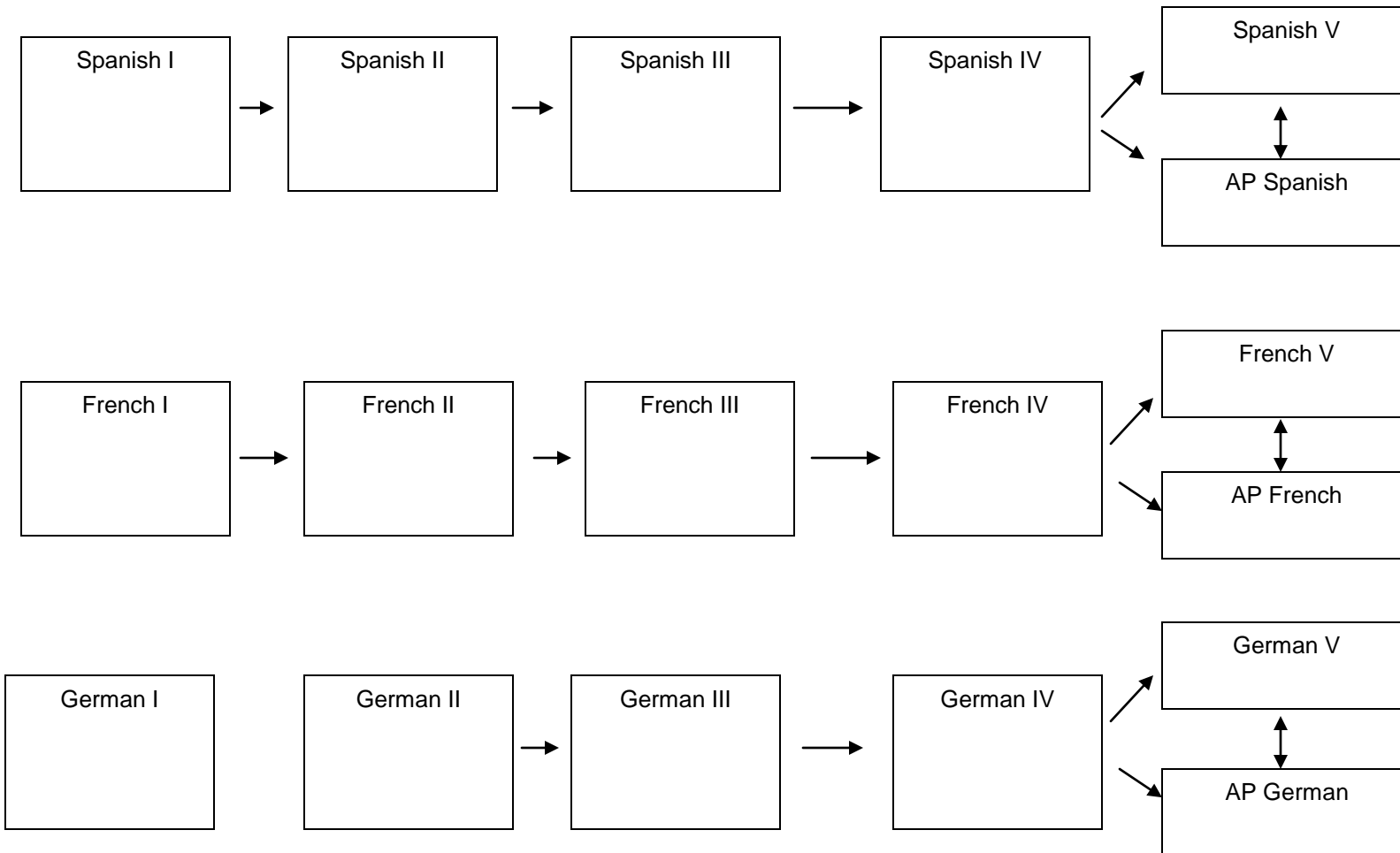

Gifted students can take both the Pre-AP Social Studies and/or Gifted Psychology A course their freshman year if they desire. **Pre-AP Social Studies students will receive an additional .5 quality point towards their GPA qualification.**
